PROPOSED FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

A parking lot approximately 70' x 150' would be constructed in the northwest corner of the park. The lot would have a bituminous surface. Two miles of hiking trails would be developed. Three primitive picnic sites would be maintained with about eight picnic tables and charcoal grills at each site. In the future a shelter with sanitary facilities would be constructed.

GEOLOGY

0 to 4 feet of loess overlying limestone. Outcroppings are common in the bluffs. Underlying this is Decorah shale, Platteville limestone, Glenwood shale, and St. Peter sandstone.

DRAINAGE

Some run-off on east side flows directly to the Zumbro River, but most would flow through city storm sewers. None would enter a marshy area.

TOURISM

No significant change anticipated that would affect the economy of Rochester.
