

Indian Heights

'the bodies were buried on a bluff nearly west of the site where the Cascade mill now stands'.....History of Olmsted and Winona Counties 1883

'small burying ground on a beautiful and slightly point of bluff on the north edge of Rochester on the now farm of Carl L. Schultz near the Donahue Quarry and the Cascade mill'History of Olmsted County Mn 1910

'the graves were there as late as 1862, but now the rocks are bare and graves gone'.....History of Olmsted County Mn 1910

'cemetery was on the hill north of town to the south of where Dr. Asbury's is now located'.....Post Bulletin article June 7, 1929

1956 letter from Ruth Schultz Taft (Mrs. James Taft) who was reared on the Schultz farm property. In this letter Ms. Taft referenced a 1946 Post Bulletin article that stated that *'the burials took place on what is now Indian Heights Subdivision (located north of 14 St NW between 5th and 8th Avenues'*. Ms. Taft did not dispute the accuracy of the article.

1960 letter from Ruth Schultz Taft (Mrs. James Taft) where she offered for sale 30 acres and she indicated that the site being offered *was the site of Indian burials on 'the point of the hill'*.
